- 24% Strong Democrat

*Polling was conducted online from May 6-10, 2022. Using its Bias Correct Engine to attain a representative sample, Change Research polled 564 likely 2022 voters in Nebraska's 2nd Congressional District. Post-stratification was performed on age, gender, race/ethnicity, education, ZIP code, and 2020 presidential vote.*
